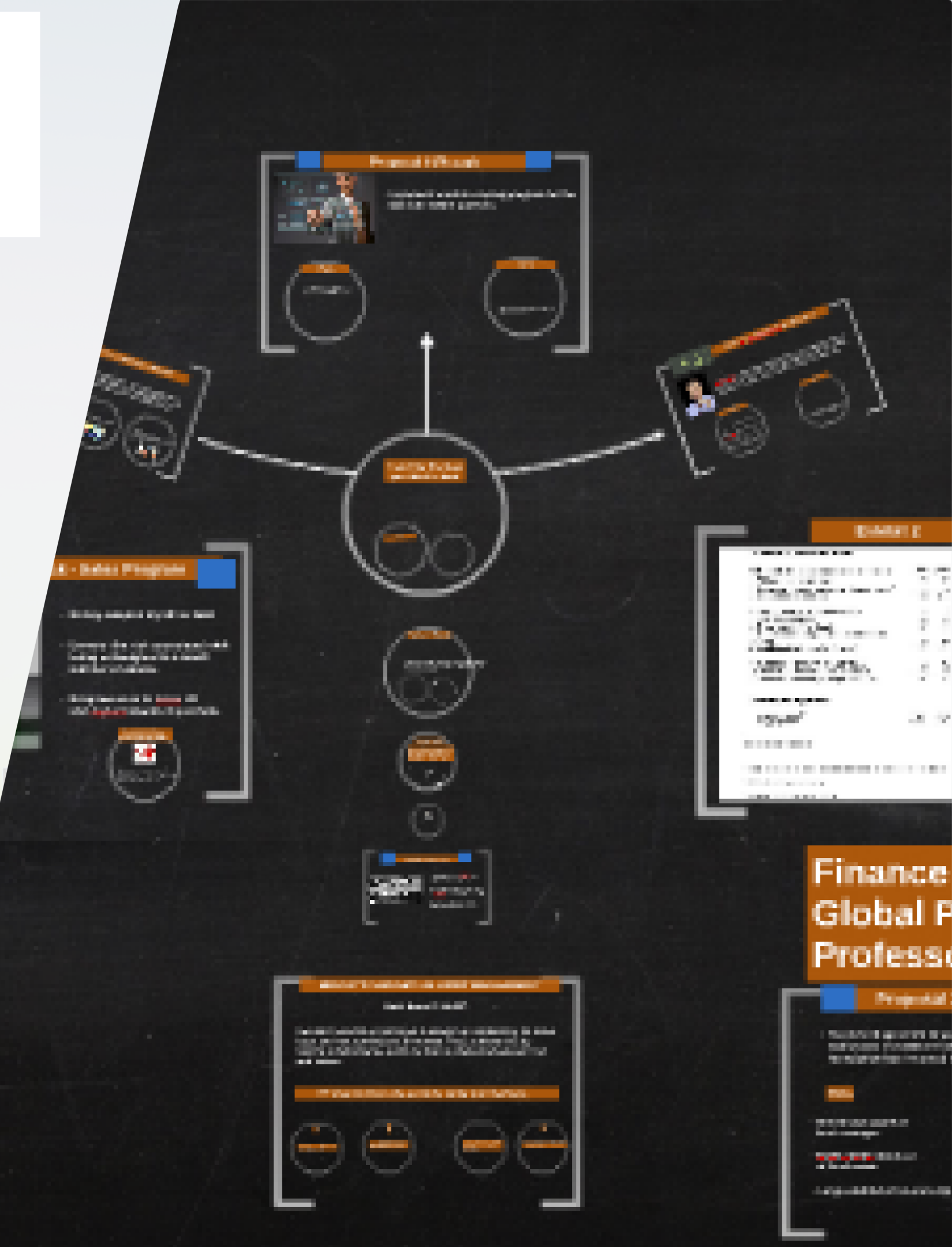

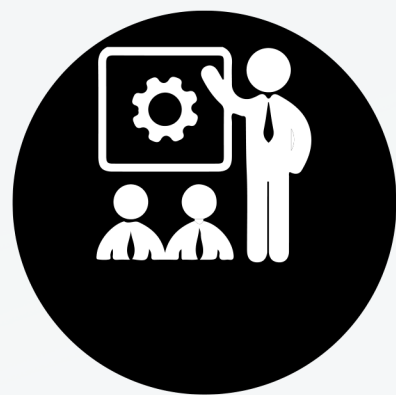

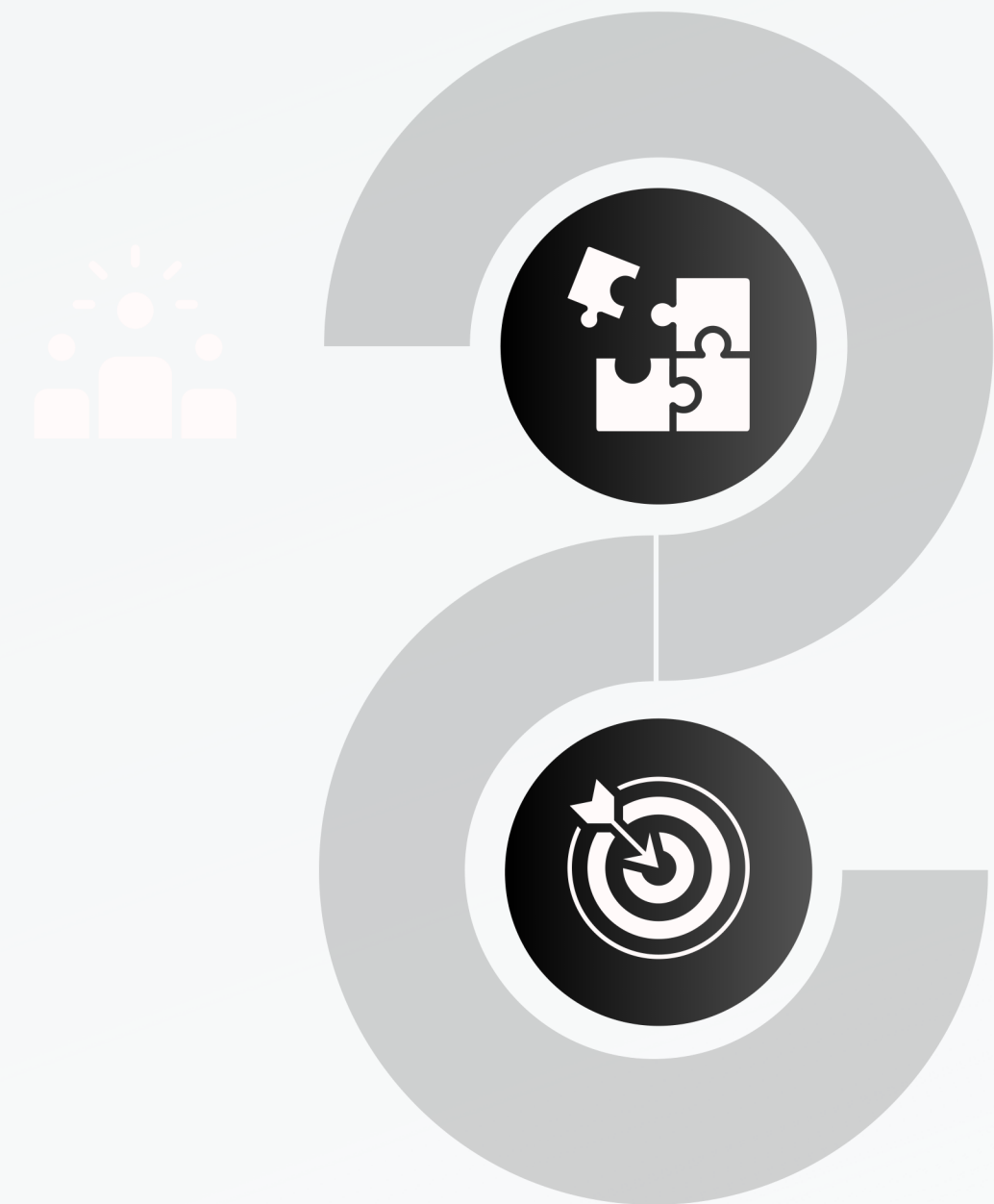
A case solution generally refers to an approach that seeks to identify the most appropriate course of action to take in the context of a particular case.
