Introduction

The 2013 Boston Marathon bombing was a disaster that all affected three people dead and over 260 injured. In this act, the most crucial force which helped in combating the affectation of the attack was the Massachusetts National Guard (MANG). Originally deployed for security purposes at the event, the Guard became relevant for rescue and search at the scene, thus displaying its relevance for domestic disasters.

There were more than 400 personnel from the Massachusetts National Guard deployed at the scene to help in managing security for the marathon. When bombings occurred near the end line, members of MANG were quickly in a position to switch from providing support service to responding to bomb explosion.

Ranging from ordinary unanticipated terrorist attack response to the coordinated efforts comprising of several agencies, the Guard is faced with the challenge of responding to different threats and ensuring security of the public.
